### Bank of Bermuda Foundation Sir John W. Cox University Scholarship for Postgraduate Studies 2015

**Awarded annually to a Bermudian pursuing Postgraduate education overseas and is valued at BD\$30,000 per annum, for up to four years.**

The 2015 Bank of Bermuda Foundation Sir John W. Cox University Scholarship for Postgraduate Studies has been awarded to **Andrew Fleming**.

He was recently awarded the Mount Saint Vincent University Valedictorian Prize and the Governor General of Canada's Medal. **Awarded annually. The Scholarship is tenable at a university or other institution of higher education approved by the Scholarship Selection Committee of Bank of Bermuda Foundation.**

The Scholarship is specifically for candidates studying Visual, Performing and Applied Arts including, but not limited to: (a) Visual Arts - drawing, painting, sculpture, ceramics, printmaking, photography, video and filmmaking; (b) Performing Arts - dance, music, opera and theatre; (c) Applied Arts - architecture, industrial design, graphic design, fashion design, interior design and decorative art.

The Bank of Bermuda Foundation John D. Campbell Arts Scholarship has been awarded to **Marquedelle Rodriquez**.



**Marquedelle** is attending Whistling Woods International University in Mumbai, India where he will obtain a B.Sc in Filmmaking as well as Diploma in filmmaking.
