
Whether it's Bermuda College, community colleges, vocational training, undergraduate, arts, or postgraduate degrees, our scholarship programme is designed to empower our recipients to Dream Big.

This commitment reflects our vision that there are equitable opportunities for people to lead purposeful lives, have financial security and enjoy a sense of belonging within the community.

Generally, we award scholarships on the following basis, taking into consideration students' budgets, any other scholarships awarded and the duration of their studies:

- Bermuda College up to \$15,000 for up to two years
- Community College up to \$35,000 for up to two years
- Undergraduate up to \$35,000 for up to four year
- Arts Degree up to \$35,000 for up to four years
- PostGraduate up to \$35,000 for up to four years
- SkillUp up to \$35,000 for up to two years


Grace Amaradasa

Yari Mello






